The building is 40' (l) $\times 20'$ (w) $\times 10'$ (h) and made of steel I-beams with coated metal siding and roof. The building will have two (2) rooms – one (1) partition wall between the battery storage and relay control panel rooms. Foundation will be installed by Austin Energy (AE).
